Leverage Existing Events

Emergency Management

Emergency management is the managerial function charged with creating the framework within which communities reduce vulnerability to hazards and cope with disasters.

Basic Public Information Officer Course (G290)

The Maine Emergency Management Agency will conduct the Federal Emergency Management Agency training program Basic Public Information Officer Course (G290) September 25th and 26th, 2012 in Portland, Maine.

Course Details:

The course will be held at the Portland Water District Nixon Training Center located at 225 Douglass Street in Portland, ME. Classes will run from 8:15 to 4:30 daily.

Breaks and lunch will be provided, lodging is available on a per case basis; please contact MEMA for further details on eligibility. All other expenses are the responsibility of the student.

This 2-day course is intended for the new or less experienced PIO (in order to be NIMS compliant all agencies must have a designated and trained Public Information Officer.). Program emphasis is on the basic skills and knowledge needed for emergency management public information activities.

Topics include the role of the PIO in emergency management, conducting awareness campaigns, news release writing public speaking, and television interviews. Completion of FEMA Public Information Officer Awareness Course (G 289) or the online IS 29 is a prerequisite for attendance of the program, certificate must accompany application.

Selection Criteria:

Preference will be given to State, County and local emergency management and emergency services staff who have either full or part time direct responsibility for public information in their communities or departments.

Applicants will include an organizational chart indicating their position in local or departmental public information functions. Students should bring copies of their organization's Public Information plan and laptop computers if available.

Instructors:

Lynette Miller, MEMA PIO, and Mike Grant, MEMA Training Officer will serve as instructors.

April: Members attended and staffed an information booth at the Maine Prepares Conference in Augusta.

May 12: 15 of our members attended a Large Animal Orientation Class at Riding to the Top Therapy Center in Windham.

Reporting Deadline September 30, 2012

To remain compliant with the National Incident Management System (NIMS), jurisdictions must update their NIMSCAST data prior to, Sunday, September 30, 2012.

Each community within Cumberland County has identified and designated a NIMS Coordinator and who serves as the NIMSCAST Administrator to maintain and report the town's progress towards NIMS Compliancy.

At noon on, Sunday, September 30, 2012, Cumberland County EMA will electronically submit (roll-up) each jurisdiction's NIMS Status Report to MEMA and to FEMA NIMS Integration Center.



Hurricane!

Article from Maine Prepares

A hurricane is a tropical cyclone in which winds reach sustained speeds of 74 miles per hour (category 1) or more and blow in a large spiral around a relatively calm center (the "eye"). Hurricanes produce damage and destruction from heavy rainfalls, winds, and flooding.

In Maine, hurricanes don't happen often but they can be devastating when they do. Recent storms that had impact on Maine are: Carol and Edna in 1954, Donna in 1960, Gloria in 1985, and Bob in 1991.



One of the most common disaster preparation mistakes is that people do not prepare while the sun is shining. When disaster is approaching everyone is after the same resources and they quickly become scarce. Lines are long, traffic is bad, and tempers are short. Start now to put together your disaster supply kit. If you have children involve them in the game of finding items on your list. Prepare now, it'll take less time.

Some hurricane preparedness considerations:

- Plan where you will go and how you will get there if you have to evacuate.
- Have two evacuation routes not subject to flooding. Know whether your home could be subject to flooding. Contact your town or [county emergency management agency](#) if you're not sure.
- Purchase flood insurance if your home could possibly flood. Homeowner's insurance does not cover floods.
- Plan for the safety of your pets. Most shelters do not accept pets.
- Purchase a NOAA Weather Alert Radio
- Talk with other family members about your plan especially if you have medical or functional needs or mobility limitations
- If you own a boat [have a hurricane plan](#) for it
- Contact your local or county emergency management agency or American Red Cross chapter if you have questions
